H.O.O.V.E.S. began because I experienced firsthand what happens when traditional approaches are not enough.

Many veterans complete programs. They attend sessions. They check the boxes. Yet they still struggle to reconnect to clarity, purpose, and control.

I did not want to create another program. I wanted to build a structure that restores capacity.

At H.O.O.V.E.S., we do not relive the past. We build the skills required to move forward. Our model is immersive, disciplined, and research aligned. It integrates horse-guided experience, resilience training, peer accountability, and measurable outcome tracking.

Participants are active, not passive. They engage fully. That is why 100 percent of those who begin the program complete it.

We are not offering temporary relief. We are building a national model for veteran reintegration rooted in dignity and measurable change.



THE WORK | OUR METHOD

This is not a riding program.

It is a structured, research-aligned intervention model.

Participants engage in 5-day immersive intensives integrating horse-guided experience, resilience training, peer integration, and measurable outcome tracking within a controlled environment.

The horses respond to presence and regulation rather than words. Insight is experienced. Integration is practiced.

Many of our horses are rescues themselves — survivors whose steadiness now helps others rebuild.

VALIDATED THROUGH RESEARCH. DESIGNED FOR MEASURABLE CHANGE.

In 2024, H.O.O.V.E.S. participated in a blind observational study evaluating the impact of our 5-day Healing Intensives on veterans living with PTSD.

This ensures:

- ★ ACCOUNTABILITY
- ★ CREDIBILITY
- ★ REPLICABILITY
- ★ INSTITUTIONAL CONFIDENCE

We are building a model grounded in evidence, not anecdote.

Peer-Reviewed Research Study Findings

Veterans began the program with an average PTSD score of 55 on the PCL-5 (scores above 33 indicate probable PTSD).



After just five days, the average score **dropped to 25** — below the clinical cutoff. 53% of participants no longer met the criteria for PTSD.



At 120 days post-program, the average score **dropped even further to 21**, proving the healing wasn't temporary — **it lasted.**

STEWARDSHIP IN ACTION

At H.O.O.V.E.S., every dollar is deployed with intention. We invest in capacity, infrastructure, and programming that restore strength, rebuild identity, and help veterans return to the lives they fought to protect.

Demand for programming continued to grow in 2025 as more veterans sought immersive, horse guided healing experiences.

Mission investments included::


- ★ Veteran healing intensives

EXPENSE ALLOCATIONS

The majority of organizational resources are directed toward direct mission delivery and the infrastructure required to safely operate the sanctuary and veteran programming.



Every program investment supports the horses, sanctuary, and immersive environment where veterans rebuild strength, identity, and purpose.



STRUCTURAL STRENGTH

H.O.O.V.E.S. is land anchored and asset backed. Our sanctuary infrastructure and horses form the foundation that makes immersive veteran programming possible.

VOLUNTEER IMPACT. COMMUNITY COMMITMENT.

H.O.O.V.E.S. is sustained by disciplined volunteer leadership and committed service.

In 2025, volunteers contributed **6,015 hours**, representing an estimated **\$201,442 in service value**.

This is not auxiliary support. It is structural capacity.

MISSION-ALIGNED SERVING

- ★ **Animal Care** | Daily feeding, grooming, and welfare oversight for rescued horses.
